## National Events

### New Oil and Gas Block Licensing Policy

- Petroleum Minister Dharmendra Pradhan introduced a new oil and gas block licensing policy that is expected to open up 2.8 million square kilometres of sedimentary basins to exploration and production activities.
- The OALP, a part of the government's Hydrocarbon Exploration and Licensing Policy (HELP), gives exploration companies the option to select the exploration blocks on their own, without having to wait for the formal bid round from the Government.

### Web Application For Legal Aid

The National Legal Services Authority (NALSA) launched a Web Application for free Legal Services to prisoners, and the Legal Services Management System developed through the NIC.

### COMMIT

- Dr Jitendra Singh launched a new training programme Comprehensive Online Modified Modules on Induction Training (COMMIT) for State Government officials.
- The objective of this training programme is to improve the public service delivery mechanism and provide citizen centric administration through capacity building of officials who interact with the citizens on day-to-day basis.

### 31st Anniversary of Mizo Peace Accord

## Weekly Current Affairs: 30 June - 8 July

---

- The 31st anniversary of the signing of the historic Mizo peace accord between the Union government and the erstwhile underground Mizo National Front (MNF) was celebrated in Mizoram.

### Aji Dam Inaugurated

- Prime Minister Narendra Modi welcomed the arrival of Narmada river waters in the city's main water reservoir Aji dam, solving its perennial water woes.
- The Narmada water reaching the dam will resolve the water woes of the people of this city in Saurashtra region which has been facing perennial water shortage due to deficient rains.

### PACS and RuPay Computerised

- Odisha Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik inaugurated computerisation of PACS and launched RuPay Kisan Credit cards in the state.
- Odisha is the first state to implement an integrated Core Banking Solution Project covering all three tiers of short-term cooperative credit structure - state cooperative bank, district central cooperative banks and 2,708 primary agriculture cooperative societies.

### TransStadia Inaugurated

- Indian Prime Narendra Modi formally inaugurated TransStadia in Ahmedabad, Gujarat earlier today. The multi-purpose sports complex also hosts a 20-000 seater state-of-the-art football stadium, the first of its kind in the state.

### Vikrikar Bhawan Renamed

- 'Vikrikar Bhavan' the headquarters of Maharashtra government's erstwhile Sales Tax department, was renamed as 'GST Bhavan' as the new tax regime rolled out.

### Innovate in India Program

- The first ever Industry-Academia mission to accelerate biopharmaceutical development in India will be formally launched by the Cabinet Minister for Science and Technology, Earth Sciences, Environment, Forests and Climate Change, Dr. Harsh Vardhan
- The program named Innovate in India (i3) will witness an investment of USD 250 million with USD 125 million as a loan from world Bank and is anticipated to be a game changer for the Indian Biopharmaceutical industry

### Free Education for Transgender

- The Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU) announced exemption of fees for its transgender students of all programmes.

### Textiles India 2017

- Narendra Modi inaugurated Textiles India 2017, Indias first ever mega textiles trade fair, being held at Gandhinagar, Gujarat.
- Textiles India 2017 gives a fillip to Honourable Prime Ministers dream of Make in India.

### Separate Agri-Budget of Telangana

- Telangana would have a separate budget for agriculture from the next year.
- Chief Minister K Chandrasekhar Rao decided to substantially enhance funds for the agriculture sector and present a separate agriculture budget

### Six Crore Saplings Planted in MP

- With an aim to create a Guinness World Record, the Madhya Pradesh government carried out a drive to plant six crore saplings in 12-hours along the banks of river Narmada.

- The indigenously developed Quick Reaction Surface-to-Air (QRSAM) short-range missile, which has a capability of engaging multiple targets, was successfully test-fired from a test range along the Odisha coast

### G-Ride in Kerala

- Kerala Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan launched G-Ride, a digital ride sharing platform designed and deployed for the IT industry by the Group of Technology Companies (GTech), the industry body of IT companies in the state.

### TERI, Second Best Think Tank

- The Energy Resources Institute (TERI) has been ranked as the second best climate think tank in the world.
- The rankings were released by the the International Center for Climate Governance, which focuses on the design of climate policy and related governance issues.
- Established in 1974, it was formerly known as Tata Energy and Resource Institute.

### No Excise on Tobacco

- The finance ministry has removed additional excise duty on tobacco, pan masala and cigarettes with effect from July 1, following the GST implementation.

- This will be the third village to be adopted by the Prime Minister in his Lok Sabha constituency of Varanasi.

### MERIT App Launched

- Union Minister of State (IC) for Power, Coal, New & Renewable Energy and Mines, Shri Piyush Goyal launched here today the 'MERIT app (Merit Order Despatch of Electricity for Rejuvenation of Income and Transparency)' and the e-bidding portal for providing e-Bidding solution to States to select Independent Power Producers (IPPs) for procurement of power by transferring their domestic coal under the scheme of flexibility in utilization of domestic coal.

### White Tiger Spotted

- A rare 'white tiger' with a pale skin color has been spotted for the first time in the Nilgiris by a wildlife photographer, arousing interest among conservationists and forest officials on whether it is a true genetic mutant.
- Photographer Nilanjan Ray from Bengaluru spotted the cat at an undisclosed location on a recent trip to the Nilgiri Biosphere Reserve.

- The Karnataka government has launched the 'Elevate 100' scheme to identify and nurture innovative start-ups.

### 7 Pacts Signed between India & Israel

- India and Israel signed seven agreements to increase cooperation in key sectors like space, agriculture and water conservation after Prime Minister Narendra Modi held in-depth talks with his Israeli counterpart Benjamin Netanyahu.

### India Declared Bird-Flu Free

- India has declared itself free from Bird Flu (highly pathogenic Avian Influenza - H5N1 and H5N8) and notified it to the World Organisation for Animal Health.

### High Performance Academy in Bhubaneswar

- The Odisha government signed an Expression of Intent (EOI) with the International Association of Athletics Federations (IAAF) and Athletics Federation of India (AFI) to establish a High Performance Academy in Bhubaneswar.

### Kanyashree Utsav of Bengal

- July 25 will mark the celebration of Kanyashree Utsav
- The day will witness representatives from all corners of the state coming together to congratulate accomplished Kanyashrees, who will be felicitated by the Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee herself.

### Jigyasa Program Launched

- Jigyasa, a student- scientist connect programme was officially launched in the national capital
- Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR), has joined hands with Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (KVS) to implement this programme.

### New Anti-Hijacking Law

- The country's new anti-hijacking law, which prescribes capital punishment in the event of death of "any person", has come into force following a government notification.
- The 2016 Anti-Hijacking Act replaces a 1982-vintage law, according to which hijackers could be tried only in the event of death of hostages, such as flight crew, passengers and security personnel.

### MRP; Sole Price Decider

- From January 1, 2018, the price of a packaged good would no longer depend on where you bought it — be it a local kirana store, a mall, a five-star hotel or an airport.
- The Consumer Affairs Ministry has amended the rules that govern packaged commodities to this effect.
- As per the amended Legal Metrology rules for packaged commodities, the retail sale price shall be the maximum retail price (MRP) inclusive of all taxes, with the provision to round off the price to the nearest rupee or 50 paise.

## International Events



### Malabar Naval Exercise

- The Malabar naval exercise involving Indian, American and Japanese navies will kick start on July 10 in the Bay of Bengal, amid China's growing military assertiveness in the disputed South China Sea.
- A sizeable number of aircraft, naval ships and nuclear submarines of the navies of the three countries will be part of the annual exercise, considered a major war game in the region.

### Global Treaty to Ban Nuclear Weapon

- A global treaty banning nuclear weapons was adopted at the United Nations despite opposition from nuclear powers Britain, France and the United States which said it disregards the reality of dealing with international security threats such as North Korea.
- The treaty was adopted by a vote of 122 in favor with one country — NATO member The Netherlands — voting against, while Singapore abstained.

### Global Index of Cybersecurity

- India is ranked a high 23rd out of 165 nations in a global index that measures the commitment of nations across the world to cybersecurity.
- The second Global Cybersecurity Index (GCI), released by the UN telecommunications agency International Telecommunication Union (ITU), said only about half of all countries have a cybersecurity strategy or are in the process of developing one and urged more countries to consider national policies to protect against cybercrime.

### City of Hebron Declared Endangered Heritage Site

- UNESCO declared the Old City of Hebron an endangered world heritage site, sparking outrage from Israel in a new spat at the international body

### India has contributed USD 100,000 to a UN fund

- India has contributed USD 100,000 to a UN fund to help developing countries actively participate in the discussion of tax issues, becoming the first country to make the contribution
- The UN Trust Fund for International Cooperation in Tax Matters (the UN Tax Fund) received its first financial voluntary contribution from India, the UN Department of Economic and Social Affairs Office for Financing for Development Office announced.

### Theresa May Elected PM Again

- British Prime Minister Theresa May's Conservative minority government secured lawmakers' backing for its legislative plans by a narrow margin but only after making a sudden concession on abortion funding to stave off defeat.

### Myanmar Joint Trade Committee (JTC) Meeting

- The 6th India – Myanmar Joint Trade Committee (JTC) Meeting co-chaired by Smt. Nirmala Sitharaman, Minister of Commerce & Industry from India and Dr. Than Myint, Union Commerce Minister from Myanmar was held at New Delhi.

### German Legalise Same-Sex Marriage

- The lower house of the German Parliament voted to legalize same-sex marriage after a brisk but emotional debate
- The historic decision came with a swiftness rare in Germany's usually staid politics, just five days after Chancellor Angela Merkel unexpectedly relaxed her party's opposition to same-sex marriage and allowed lawmakers to vote on the issue according to their consciences.

### Liuzhou Forest City of China

---

- After China's Nanjing city became the first Asian city to be getting a vertical forest (by 2018), China is building a forest city – Liuzhou Forest City – which will boast urban settlements and vertical forests. And, this will help curb pollution by leaps and bounds.

### China's First Female Leader

- Carrie Lam was sworn in as Hong Kong's chief executive, becoming its first female leader and the fourth person to hold the top government post since China regained control of the former British colony in 1997.

### Syrian Currency With Face of President Bashar Assad

- A new 2,000 Syrian Lira (\$3.9) bank note with the face of President Bashar Assad goes into circulation
- The notes are the first time Syria will depict President Bashar Assad on its currency since he took office 17 years ago.

### Ebola Ended in Congo

- World Health Organization (WHO) declared the end of the most recent outbreak of Ebola virus disease (EVD) in the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC).

### India and Thailand Military Exercise

- A 14-day joint military training exercise between India and Thailand started in Himachal Pradesh

### ADB Granted \$220 Million for Rajasthan

### The MODI Flower

- A new fast-growing Israeli flower was today named after Prime Minister Narendra Modi, in a special gesture to mark the first visit of an Indian premier to the Jewish nation.
- Israeli Crysanthumun flower will now be called "MODI"

### 4 Largest Investors in UK

- India has slipped by one spot to become the fourth-largest foreign investor into the UK, according to the official figures
- The US remains on the top, investing in 577 projects in the UK, with China (including Hong Kong) remaining in second place with 160 projects. India set up 127 new projects in Britain last year and safeguarded 7,645 existing jobs as a result and created 3,999 new jobs in 2016-17

### Germany Clinched 2017 FIFA Confederations Cup

- Germany battled their way to the 2017 FIFA Confederations Cup title, beating Chile 1-0 in a tight final in Russia.

### Asian Athletics Championships 2017

- India's Manpreet Kaur claimed the gold medal in the women's shot put, while defending champion Vikas Gowda failed to retain his title in the men's discus throw event on the opening day of the Asian Athletics Championships 2017

### Aegon Championship 2017

- Novak Djokovic has won the Aegon Championship in Eastbourne by beating Gael Monfils in Saturday's final.
- The world No 2's preparation for Wimbledon concluded with a 6-3 6-4 victory at Devonshire Park - just his second title of 2017 so far.

### FINO Operationalise its Payment Bank

- FINO Payments Bank has commenced operations as a payments bank with effect from June 30, according to the Reserve Bank of India.
- FINO PayTech Ltd, Navi Mumbai, was one of the 11 applicants which were issued in-principle approval for setting up a payments bank.

### NMCE Merged With ICEX

- National Multi-Commodity Exchange (NMCE), India's first demutualized multi-commodities exchange, will merge with Indian Commodity Exchange (ICEX)
- The proposed merger will create India's third largest commodities exchange, offering a range of contracts including bullion, oil, rubber and other agri-commodities.

### No Restriction on Cash Dealing With Credit Card

- Restrictions on cash dealings of Rs. 2 lakh or more will not apply to credit card bill payments, business correspondents appointed by banks and issuers of prepaid instrument.
