## **INVIDIOUS**

(adj.) likely to arouse or incur resentment or anger in others.

Syn: unpleasant, awkward, difficult; undesirable, unenviable, prejudicial, discriminatory

Atn: pleasant, desirable, fair, delightful, lovable

**Exp:** Neelam's **invidious** behaviour disturbed others and got him kicked out of the movie theater.



## **ENGENDER**

(verb.) cause or give rise to (a feeling, situation, or condition).

Syn: generate, arouse, rouse, provoke, incite, kindle, trigger

Atn: destroy, halt, prevent, repress, discourage

**Exp:** By revealing the president's secrets, the reporter hoped to **engender** feelings of distrust among the public.



# **FERVID**

#### (adj.) intensely enthusiastic or passionate

Syn: fervent, ardent, passionate, vehement, heated, earnest, eager, avid,

Atn: half-hearted, dull, indifferent, uncaring

**Exp:** By revealing the president's secrets, the reporter hoped to **engender** feelings of distrust among the public.



## **TENUOUS**

(adj.) very weak or slight.

Syn: insubstantial, flimsy, negligible, weak,

fragile, nebulous

Atn: heavy, thick, substantial, firm



**Exp:** The uneducated man made a **tenuous** argument against the importance of obtaining a higher education

## **TITILLATE**

#### (verb.) arouse (someone) to interest or mild excitemen

Syn: arouse, excite, stimulate, stir, thrill, interest, attract, please, fascinate, seduce

Atn: bore, disenchant, turn off, tire,

**Exp:** In order to **titillate** consumer interest, the company is offering free shipping on all purchases
